- Announcement on Permanent Deaconate Before his retirement, Bishop William Lee introduced the Permanent Deaconate in the Diocese of Waterford & Lismore. The first candidates commenced training in September 2010. This ministry is open to men between the ages of 25 and 60 (for single men); and 35 and 60 (for married men). The training consists of a preparatory year, followed by three years' academic, spiritual, pastoral and human formation. Those who are ordained as Deacons will preside at baptisms, weddings, funerals and other public prayer occasions. They will preach the homily and assist at Mass. They will be involved in many pastoral works and in Christian education at all levels. They will be given a special role in the area of social justice and works of charity. When ordained they will be assigned for service to a parish or group of parishes, or to Diocesan responsibilities. The ordination of Deacons is a restoration of a significant ministry which was a feature of Church life in the first five centuries.
