# Reach Out

second last Sunday in October each year, is the focal point of Mission Month.


Mission Sunday 2009, the theme for which is *Reach Out*, takes place on **18<sup>th</sup> October**. Through the celebration of Mission Sunday, Catholics are encouraged to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity, through prayer, sacrifice and financial contribution.

Each year the Mission Sunday collection is organised by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. In 2008 the Irish people

contributed over €2.6million. Funds raised are distributed to mission projects throughout the world and assist missionaries in reaching out to communities in need, both spiritually and materially.

### A Note on Parish Finances

Sincere thanks to all who regularly and generously contribute to the weekly collections. The present day-to-day running costs of both churches, houses, graveyards and hall amount to €5,000 approximately per month and the weekly offertory and envelope collections goes towards these ongoing costs. The boxes of collection envelopes to cover the next twelve months are at present being delivered to every house in the parish.

Special attention has to be drawn to the financial needs of the parish at this current time. The regular running costs do not take into account any unforeseen expenses that occur from time to time and while a number of issues have already been addressed there's still a great deal of work to be done.

Recently the driveway at the Parochial House in Fenor was resurfaced with tarmacadam at a cost of €12,800, though the Fenor Sale of Work contributed €1,500 towards that expense. The parish made a contribution of €1,000 to our neighbours in the Church of Ireland community towards the work being carried out on the roof of Annestown Church. Fenor Church has had its exterior doors and gates painted but Dunhill Church and surrounds are in need of a considerable amount of work, the cost of which will be extensive. For example:

- Painting of the church at a cost of about €7,000 will commence this week.
- To comply with Health & Safety regulations, emergency lighting battery packs must be installed and, in addition to various electrical works which have already been carried out, the electrical bill for Dunhill Church alone will cost a few thousand euro.
- Tarmac of the graveyard and area surrounding the church is planned before Christmas, as is the cleaning and restoration of the priests' graves. Initial estimates suggest that €18,000 to €22,000 will be required here.
- The choir gallery has new heaters and improved sockets installed and requires further work to facilitate the music ministry.

#### The Parish Hall

Following a Health & Safety inspection the Parish Hall in Dunhill had to be closed and a program of works has been put in place to make it safe and available for use by groups and members of the community.

- Phase 1 will cost in the region of €11,000 and will involve electrical and fire safety works in the main hall itself.
- Phase 2 will cost about €25,000 and involves re-roofing the entire back area covering three rooms.
