- There will **be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** in Dunhill Church this coming Wednesday from after 10.00 a.m. Mass until 1.00 p.m. and in Fenor Church on Friday from after 10.00 a.m. Mass until 12.00 noon.
- All of us in Dunhill & Fenor, and in the wider Christian community, were devastated this week to learn of the break-in at Fenor Church last Sunday night. The church safe was stolen from the building along with its contents: three chalices (dated 1742, 1836 and 1915); one ciborium; two patens; the Holy Oil stocks; and various keys. Having opened the safe the culprits realised that there was no money inside and they left the sacred vessels on Annestown Beach where they were found by a man out walking. The opened safe was later retrieved from the water at Annestown. We are delighted to have the sacred vessels back in our possession and are extremely grateful to Supt Lynch and the Gardaí at Tramore and Kilmeaden for their persistence and commitment to retrieving the stolen property. We also express our deep gratitude to the man who found and returned the sacred vessels; to the Irish Coastguard who assisted the Gardaí in Annestown; to the radio and print media for their coverage of the events which led to the prompt return of the sacred vessels. Thanks also to all in the parish and beyond who dedicated their prayers to the safe return of the sacred vessels.
- The <u>Dunhill & Fenor Parish Pastoral Council</u> (PPC) held an information and discernment meeting on Tuesday evening to encourage parishioners to consider volunteering to serve the parish as members of the PPC. We are grateful to all who submitted nominations and to those who attended the meeting.
