 - Q. The beatitudes are hard to take. How can the poor be happy, or those who mourn or suffer persecution?

 A. It is a much better translation to say 'Blessed are' rather than 'Happy are'. Happy is largely a feeling whereas blessed indicates one's standing with God. Jesus rejected the prosperity gospel which regards prosperity, power and prestige as blessings from God, thereby regarding poverty, illness, misfortune etc as signs of punishment for sinfulness. Jesus proclaimed that those who suffered such misfortunes are certainly not outside the scope of God's blessing. Notice how the rewards of God are promised in the future, not in the present.
