- The <u>Care and Repair Programme</u>, organised by Age Action Ireland, has a number of benefits including having a pool of volunteers to carry out small repairs and to complete minor home tasks for older people. Volunteers help with a variety of small tasks that an older person may find difficult to do such as gardening, changing light bulbs, minor home decoration, etc. A "job" is expected to take no longer than an hour. The service is free of charge; the client only pays for the cost of materials used. The Care Service is a home visiting service using volunteers to provide social contact to older people who are at risk of isolation. Volunteers are of all ages and both genders. All volunteers are vetted and carry official Care and Repair identification cards. Retired people also make great volunteers.
