• **Why are we getting a new edition of the Roman Missal?**

The new edition of the Missal will come into full use over a period of time between September and the First Sunday of Advent 2011. The new edition is necessary for a number of reasons. Firstly, in the years since 1975 when our current Missal was published, a number of additional texts have been made available for use in the Mass. These include additional Eucharistic Prayers, some new Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Masses for over 20 new Feasts of Saints (for example St Pius of Pietrelcina – Padre Pio, Edith Stein, Maximilian Kolbe). These and other new materials now need to go into the Missal so that they can be used in our celebrations.

- This year's **Summer Cemetery Mass** at Fenor will be celebrated on Thursday evening, August 04th, and the Cemetery Mass in Dunhill will be celebrated on the following Tuesday, August 09th.
- The annual **Sacristans Collection** will be taken up in both churches next weekend. The job of the Sacristan is an unpaid, seven-days-a-week job and we are really grateful to Mrs Mary Power and Mrs Ita O'Reilly for their dedication and commitment. Next weekend is our opportunity to show our appreciation for them and for what they do for our parish community. Please give as generously as you can.
- On Saturday, August 06th, a **Sponsored Leisure Cycle** will take place in memory of Fr. Colm O'Brien, a young priest of our diocese who sadly passed away in 2009 after a long battle with cancer. The cycle will start at Saints Peter & Paul's Church, Clonmel, and travel via St. Pauls Church, Waterford, finishing at the G.A.A. Centre in Tramore. The cycle route is 40 miles but participants may cycle stage 2 only (8 miles) if they wish. There will refreshments and entertainment in the G.A.A. Centre after the cycle and there will be a raffle which people may like to support even if they are not cycling. All proceeds will go to the South Eastern Cancer Foundation.
