While many of the windows need attention, the two that have been removed are in urgent need of repair and protection. We hope to have them restored in about six weeks. - <u>When will we be using the new edition of the Roman Missal?</u> The texts of the new edition of the Roman Missal are being introduced in two phases to avoid too much change happening at once. From the second Sunday of September many dioceses will begin to use the new translations of the people's prayers and responses at Mass, for example, the Confiteor, the Gloria and the Creed. These texts will be provided on cards for the people coming to Mass. From the First Sunday of Advent the new translations of the prayers of the Mass that are led by the priest will come into use, for example, the opening prayer and the Eucharistic Prayer. The Third Edition of the Roman Missal, therefore, will be fully implemented throughout the English-speaking world on the First Sunday of Advent.

However, he is aware that in the large, public celebrations on his travels or in St Peter's Square there have been people who took the host in hand and then put it into a wallet or book to take it away as a souvenir. On these public occasions, to prevent disrespect, he prefers to see people kneel or genuflect in an act of worship and then receive on the tongue. But otherwise, as he stated in a recent book, 'I am not opposed in principle to communion in the hand.'
