- **‘I confess...’** The translation of the Confiteor that appears in the new edition of the Missal has a few changes to what we have been saying since 1975. The most obvious change will be the use of the words “through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault”. This was already retained in the Irish language translation of this prayer. The use of triplets is often employed in Latin and this was not always translated in the texts we have been using until recently. A word not translated in the current Missal is now translated as “greatly” giving us the new phrase “that I have greatly sinned”. This has its biblical roots in the words of David in 1 Chronicles 21:8. “David said to God, ‘I have sinned greatly in that I have done this thing...’”. *-prepared by the National Centre for Liturgy*
