- Holy, Holy, Holy Lord (Sanctus). The only change to this text is the phrase "Lord God of hosts" instead of "God of power and might". "Hosts" or "armies" are the usual translations of the Hebrew word 'Sabaoth'. Here it means the "heavenly hosts of angels" a phrase that we are familiar with from the second verse of the Christmas hymn "Silent Night". Institution Narrative and Consecration. You will notice some word changes to this central part of the Eucharistic prayer. The word chalice replaces the word "cup" (as in the current Irish language text) and eternal replaces everlasting. The new translation also replaces the phrase 'for all' with the phrase 'for many', translating the Latin 'pro multis'. This is not intended to imply that God's love is limited or that Christ did not die on the cross for all men and women. Rather, in translating the Latin and the Greek of the Gospels, it also acknowledged that human beings may choose to accept in faith the gift of salvation that is being offered.
