- The <u>50<sup>th</sup> International Eucharistic Congress</u> will take place in June this year and the Waterford & Lismore Diocesan Pilgrimage Day will be Thursday, 14<sup>th</sup> June. - Two years after the earthquake struck <u>Haiti</u> on January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2010, which killed up to 300,000 people and left 1.2 million people homeless, we recall how Irish people responded by donating €7.58m to fund Trócaire's emergency operation. The money was used to provide food to 1.5 million people, healthcare to one million people and shelter to 160,000 people. Q. When Jesus spoke about the kingdom of God was he referring to heaven or to life here on earth?
A. The kingdom is the central theme of the mission of Jesus in the Gospels of Mark and Matthew. Sometimes it refers to life with God in heaven, sometimes to the church community, but most often to the establishment of God's reign on earth, overcoming the power of evil in the world. Jesus began his mission with the proclamation that the kingdom of God is at hand. To that end he called people to repent and believe, that is, to leave wrongdoing behind and to follow his way. The apostles, we are told, left everything and followed him.
