 Question: A person gave me a Bible and showed me these words of Jesus: 'No one who believes in me will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already.' He told me that Catholic dogmas and sacraments are not necessary because only faith in Jesus is required. I couldn't answer him. Answer: Dogmas and sacraments are not against faith but are part of the development of faith. What is a dogma but a teaching which clarifies God's revelation in the scriptures. A good example is the development of understanding of the Blessed Trinity. Theology may be described as faith seeking an understanding. As for sacraments, these ceremonies which are based on the scriptures are a celebration of faith.
