- There will be <u>Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament</u> in Dunhill Church on Wednesday from after 10.00 a.m Mass until 12 noon but we *will not* have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in Fenor Church on Good Friday.
- The <u>Chrism Mass</u> will be celebrated by Bishop Lee and all the priests of the diocese in the Cathedral on Holy Thursday at 10.30 a.m. and the Bishop has extended an invitation to everybody to come along. It is at that Mass that the Holy Oils (Oil of Catechumens, Oil of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism) are consecrated for use during the year and the priests of the diocese renew their commitment to serve God's people. It is particularly appropriate that those preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation would be present to witness the Sacred Chrism being consecrated. This Sacred Oil will be used to confer Confirmation in our parish on April 19<sup>th</sup>. All are welcome.
- The Trócaire Lenten Campaign concludes this week and <u>Trócaire boxes</u> should be returned to the church on Holy Thursday evening. Trócaire is very grateful for your generosity to the annual Lenten Appeal.
- Good Friday is also the <u>First Friday</u> of April and Fr Paul will be visiting the sick and housebound with the Sacraments. If you, or anyone you know, would like to celebrate Confession, Anointing of the Sick or to receive the Eucharist please let us know as soon as possible.
