Question: The theme of the Congress is 'Communion with Christ and with One Another'. 'Communion with Christ' I understand but what is 'Communion with One Another'?
Answer: If I am united with Christ in the Eucharist and you are similarly united, then we are united with one another, parts of the one body. Saint Paul wrote that all who share the same spiritual food share the same source of life: one bread, one body. At the end of Mass we are sent out on the mission to love and serve the Lord beyond the walls of the church. Communion is the challenge to live in community. I like St Augustine's address to communicants: you are the Body of Christ (through Baptism); receive the Body of Christ (Eucharist); become the Body of Christ (mission and challenge).
