- Saint Watch: July 1 St Oliver Plunkett, the Bishop and Martyr, was from Irish nobility whose family supported King Charles. Ordained in Rome in 1654, he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh in 1669. He was forced to conduct a covert ministry during the suppression of priests. He was arrested and tried at Dundalk in 1679 for conspiring against the state. It was seen that Oliver would never be convicted in Ireland, and he was moved to Newgate Prison, London, where he was found guilty of high treason for "promoting the catholic faith" and was condemned to a gruesome death. He was the first catholic to die for his faith at Tyburn and the first of the Irish martyrs to be beatified. His head is in St. Peter's Church, Drogheda but most of his body is at Downside Abbey.
