- To commemorate the <u>50th Anniversary of the Opening of the Second Vatican Council</u>, the Dioceses of Ossory and Waterford & Lismore, are offering an opportunity, over four gatherings, to explore the responsibility we all have within our Church communities. There is a growing awareness of the need for a great shift in our understanding of who we are as the people of God and how we fulfil our baptismal calling within the Church. The first gathering takes place this Monday evening, 17th September, from 7.00 to 9.00 p.m. in St Patrick's Parish Centre, Loughboy, Kilkenny. Richard Gaillardetz will speak on the topic: 'We are the Church: how Vatican II gave the Church back to the people'. Further details on our Facebook page and on the posters in the churches.
- The <u>Waterford Harvest Festival</u>, which runs from 10th to 16th September 2012, is seven delicious days of fun filled foodie events with cookery demonstrations, Slow Food tours, tastings, the GIY Gathering and Street Feast, taste workshops, restaurant trails, giant quayside markets, hog roasts, street performances and big outdoor music gigs celebrating food heritage and culture in Waterford. A major part of the celebration is the Harvest Thanksgiving Mass which will be celebrated by Fr Willie Purcell, National Director for Vocations, in the Cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity, Baronstrand Street, Waterford, next Sunday, 16th September at 12 noon. - <u>World Suicide Prevention Day</u> takes place on 10th September each year to raise awareness that suicide can be prevented. This year's theme is "Suicide Prevention across the Globe: *Strengthening Protective Factors and Instilling Hope*". In Ireland, there are over 500 deaths by suicide each year; more people die of suicide than in traffic accidents. Waterford is the only city in Ireland to have its own integrated action plan for suicide prevention.
- St Joseph's Carmelite Monastery in Tallow is holding a <u>Monastic Weekend</u> for single women discerning a vocation in religious life (aged 22-38) from September 21st to 23rd, 2012.
