- Day for Life 2012 marks the beginning of a special month of prayer dedicated to the theme 'Choose Life!' People are invited to pray a special 'Prayer for the Child in the Womb' throughout the month which ends on the Feast of All the Saints of Ireland on 6 November. The prayer asks us to open our hearts to welcome every child as a unique and wonderful gift, and to help those who make our laws to uphold the uniqueness and sacredness of every human life from the moment of conception to natural death. In addition to the prayer a special pastoral message entitled 'Every human life is beautiful, every human life is precious Choose Life!' will be promoted in all 1,360 parishes of Ireland. This message will highlight the equal right to life of a mother and the child in her womb, and the right of each to be treated as individual persons. This positive message will also affirm that the child in the womb is not a potential life, but a human life with potential. The Church's annual Day for Life coincides this year with a decisive moment for Ireland. In the coming weeks, the Government is under no obligation to legislate for abortion because of this ruling of the European Court. On the contrary, the Irish Government is free to respond by seeking full protection in Irish law for the right to life of the baby in the womb. This could be done while ensuring that women in pregnancy continue to receive every treatment necessary to safeguard their lives.
- All the children who have asked to receive their **<u>First Penance and First Holy Communion</u>** in 2013 will be officially enrolled as candidates for those Sacraments during the 11.00 a.m. Mass in Dunhill next Sunday, 14th October. We pray God's blessing on them during the year ahead and on their parents, families and teachers.
- Fr Paul and the Parish Pastoral Council will host a <u>Gathering of All Parish Volunteers</u> next Sunday, 14th October, at the Seaview Celtic Clubhouse, Annestown, from 3.00 p.m. until 6.00 p.m. This is an opportunity to say thanks to all the adults who help out in any way and make a positive contribution to the life of the parish. Monsignor Michael Olden will speak on the history of Christianity in the area and supper will be served afterwards. Please ensure that you have completed and returned your volunteering paperwork (Yellow Volunteering Application Form, Green Volunteering Declaration Form and White Garda Vetting Form) to the office prior to that day.
