Question: Do you agree that the Mass nowadays lacks reverence which would be restored by going back to Latin?
Answer: The spirit of reverence is absolutely essential to good liturgy. There are celebrations where the celebrant shows deep reverence in his gestures and words, is properly vested, and music and readings light up the Word of the Lord. Sadly, there are also liturgies lacking due reverence. But it is not simply a question of language. I grew up with the Latin Mass when prayers were mumbled, readings not understood, multiple blessings were performed like swatting flies from the chalice while people said the rosary or gathered in utter boredom at the back of the church. Back to Latin? No thank you!
