 Question: When John the Baptist baptised people, was it the sacrament of Baptism?
 Answer: The sacraments as we know them did not exist before the ministry of Jesus. Baptism originally meant having a bath or a good wash. John was called the Baptiser, the Bath-man, because he used a ceremony of washing by which people might express a moral conversion from the ways of sin. Jesus took this ritual washing to a new level when he told the disciples to baptise 'in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. Christians recognise this as the institution of the sacrament.
