  - **Question**: How might one understand the difference between the merciful approach of Jesus and the drastic preaching of John the Baptist predicting doom and condemnation?
  - **Answer**: There are two ways of correcting people: the threat of punishment or the promise of reward. John the Baptist came from a people who expected a Messiah who would inaugurate a perfect society in which there would be no room for the sinner. Hence, he preached the urgency of total conversion before an impending judgement. The approach of Jesus was to give hope to the sinner. Instead of John's winnowing fan blowing away the empty chaff, he preferred to fan into flame some spark of goodness in a struggling sinner.
