- We extend a very special '<u>Céad Míle Fáilte</u>' to all visitors to our parish this weekend; especially those who have come home to be with family members and friends this Christmas. We pray that you will enjoy your stay among us and carry treasured memories with you when you leave.
- By very ancient tradition, a priest may celebrate Mass three times on Christmas Day: the Midnight Mass or "Mass of the Angels"; the Dawn Mass or "Shepherd's Mass"; and the Day Mass or "Mass of the Divine Word". He may also celebrate the Vigil Mass of Christmas which is still an anticipation of the birth of the Lord. Each of these Masses has its own readings and prayers. The <u>Vigil Mass</u> prepares us for what is about to happen 'the Virgin will conceive and give birth to a Son and they shall call him Emmanuel'. The <u>Midnight Mass</u> celebrates the actual birth 'I bring you news of great joy. This night a child is born for us, a son is given to us'. At <u>Dawn Mass</u> we hear how 'the shepherds found Mary and Joseph and the baby: and glorified God'. And at the <u>Mass during the</u> <u>Day</u> St John reminds us that 'the Word was made flesh, he lived among us, and we saw his glory'. Each Mass has its own message and meaning so come and join us for any or all of them. The times are listed above.
- The <u>Annual Christmas Collection</u> for the support of the Bishop and the Priests will be taken up at all Masses on Christmas Day. Please give as generously as you can. We offer our sincere thanks to the volunteers who prepare and distribute envelopes to all the homes in the parish. We deeply appreciate your commitment and service.
