 Question: The words at the consecration of the wine at Mass are changed from 'shed for you and for all men' to 'poured out for you and for many'. Why the change from 'all' to 'many'? Does it mean that others are excluded?

 Answer: The word 'many' is not meant to exclude anybody. There are several places in the New Testament telling us that Jesus died for the salvation of all people. However, the accounts of the Last Supper speak of the precious blood shed for many. The text of the Mass follows the words of the Last Supper as closely as possible and that is the reason for saying 'many' rather than 'all'.
