Brendan, who recently graduated in Theology at St Patrick's College in Maynooth, will begin three years of training this September and, on successful completion of all the requirements, will be ordained as a Deacon. The Diaconate is one of the three ministries of the Sacrament of Holy Orders, along with priests and bishops, and those ordained as permanent Deacons (as opposed to transitional Deacons who are on the way to priesthood) may be married. We thank Brendan for his offer of service to the Church and will wish him, his wife Bridget, and their family every good wish for the future.
