Question: ‘Those whose sins you forgive they are forgiven’. I can understand that. But what is meant by ‘whose sins you retain they are retained’? **Answer:** The mission of Jesus which he passed on to the disciples with the bestowing of the Holy Spirit was twofold. They were to celebrate God’s forgiveness of the sinner who truly repented. But they were also to pronounce God’s judgement on the sinner who had not repented. In other words, tell people that they are retained in their sinful state, that is, living in sin, until such time as they repent. Calling sin a sin is a job the Church must continue to do even when it is not fashionable or popular.
