- St Carthage (or Mochuta) hailed from a rick family in Kerry. As he loved chanting the Psalms the local king arranged for him to become a priest. Having spent a year at Bangor he founded his own monastery at Rahan in 595. It grew rapidly but opposition made him move southwards around 637. He, with hundreds of monks and their patients from the leper colony, finally arrived at Lismore, where he made a foundation. He died in 638.
- The <u>Annual Collection for the Retired Priests' Fund</u> will be taken up in both churches next weekend. There is a yellow envelope in your box of envelopes at home for this purpose. Each parish in the diocese must pay €2,200 annually, per priest working in the parish, as a contribution to the support of the retired priests of the diocese.
