- The seventh 'Choose Life' newsletter is available via our website and at www.catholicbishops.ie. It states that the Abortion Bill will provide the widest possible legal justification for deliberately and intentionally destroying the life of the unborn child, with no time limits and no mechanism for ensuring that the right to life of the unborn is adequately vindicated as required by Article 40.3.3 of the Constitution. In practice, the right to life of the unborn child will no longer be treated as equal. This Bill represents a legislative and political 'Trojan Horse' which heralds a much more liberal and aggressive abortion regime in Ireland.
