- Question: Could you please clarify for me the various sins of the tongue like blasphemy, cursing, etc.? Answer: Blasphemy is a statement of hatred or defiance of God. Profanity means taking the name of God or Jesus without proper respect and it reveals the shallowness of faith. Cursing is the opposite of prayer because it means calling down evil on somebody. Swearing is calling God as a witness to the truth of what is being said. To swear on a lie is the serious sin of perjury. Obscenity means filthy talk which offends people or degrades sexuality. Detraction means revealing the faults of another without valid reason. Calumny is harming the good name of another by false statement. Saint James wrote that the tongue may be a small part of the body but think how a tiny flame can cause a whole forest to be destroyed.
