- The <u>Year of Faith Presentations</u> continue with Fr. Gerry O'Hanlon of the Jesuit Centre for Faith and Justice who will give a talk on 'God and the Recession' on Wednesday, 09<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30 p.m. in St. John's Pastoral Centre, Waterford. Fr. O'Hanlon is an Associate Professor of Systematic Theology at the Milltown Institute. Among his recent publications are 'God and the Recession' and 'A New Vision for the Catholic Church: A View from Ireland.'
- During the summer our parish office issued over ninety letters to parishioners who have contributed greater than €250 per annum encouraging them complete forms to claim **<u>Repayment of Income Tax by Eligible Charities</u>** from the government. Only one-third replied and their forms have been processed. This has resulted in the parish receiving €14,281.88 from Revenue, at no extra expense to parishioners. Hopefully this might encourage the other two-thirds to return their forms as soon as possible. It is also an encouragement to all parishioners to use or continue using the parish envelope system to make donations so that we can get the best value for your money.
