- <u>Why do we give Easter Eggs?</u> Eggs used to be a forbidden food during Lent, making them a welcome return to the menu on Easter Day. For Christians eggs symbolise new life. We believe that through Christ's resurrection, Jesus defeated death and sin and offers people the promise of eternal life if we follow his teaching. Eggs have been a symbol of continuing life and resurrection since pre-Christian spring celebrations. Eggs had a religious significance in many ancient civilizations. Egyptians buried eggs in their tombs as did the Greeks. A Roman proverb stated "All life comes from an egg". Its probably no surprise that Christians should also adopt the egg to symbolise the resurrection of Christ. The first eggs given at Easter were bird's eggs. These eggs were painted in bright colours to give them further meaning as a gift. And to represent the new life of spring.
- <u>The Empty Tomb</u> The disciples are in a state of shock after their traumatic loss. Jesus, the one in whom they had placed so much hope, has been murdered and buried. Then, before they have time to recover, they get another shock. The body of Jesus is missing. Have there been times in your relationship with God when you have felt that you were faced with an empty tomb and still believed!
