- The season of Advent begins today, it is one of the four special seasons in the Church's Year. The others are Christmas, Lent and the Easter. The Church's Year begins with Advent and traditionally, the Advent wreath symbolises this. It is made from evergreens, leaves and branches which remind us that God is unchanging, eternal. The round shape of the wreath reminds us that God is without beginning or end. The three purple candles and the pink one represent the four weeks of Advent. The purple candles represent penance and sorrow for sin. The pink candle (Third Sunday of Advent) represents the joy of living in God's presence. The white candle in the centre is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day when Advent is over and we celebrate the Birth of Jesus, the true light who enlightens all people, a light that darkness cannot overpower.
- <u>Gospel of Matthew.</u> Year A of the Liturgical cycle begins on November 27th, the First Sunday of Advent. During Year A the Gospel readings are mostly from the Gospel of Matthew.
- Dr. Michael Mullins will continue to look at the Advent & Christmas readings entitled **Opening the Word.** The final talk will take place in St. John's Pastoral Centre, Waterford, this Wednesday 30th November at 7.30 p.m. All are welcome.
