- It has long been a tradition to place a lighted <u>Candle in the Window</u> of Christian homes on Christmas Eve night. That light is a sign that your home is a place of welcome with open doors and open hearts, especially for Christ. Please be careful with candles. Follow the maker's instructions and never leave burning candles unattended.
- <u>The First Crib.</u> In the winter of 1223 Francis of Assisi was staying at a small Friary in Greccio. A rich man from nearby offered the Friars any gift they wished at Christmas. Francis said: "I want to celebrate with you. Up the rocks you have a cave there prepare a crib full of hay; bring an ox and a donkey. I want to feel and see with my own eyes how much the Son of God wanted to be poor when he was born for love of us". And so that year all the friars and the local people gathered together at the now famous cave of Greccio. Legend has it that the infant Jesus came to life in St. Francis' arms there at the place of the First Christmas Crib.
- <u>Christmas</u> is always a mixed time of year. For some it is a joyous occasion, for some a sad time, for others a very lonely time. As we celebrate Christmas let us be mindful and conscious of our neighbours and friends. Christmas is also a time of Liturgical celebration, a time when many attend Church. Whether you are regular or occasional you are welcome. If regular, thanks for your commitment and faithfulness, if occasional, you are welcome, we miss you from our regular gatherings. Perhaps this Christmas you might make a resolution or commitment to try and come more often. You have nothing to fear. The doors of the Church are always open and welcoming.
