Did You Know! In many countries, Shrove Tuesday was, and still is, a day of public revelry and carnivals. But, in Ireland long ago, it was usually a family celebration. For the faithful, Lent meant abstaining from eggs and all dairy products, so all of these had to be used up before Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday is a Christian holy day of prayer, fasting and repentance. ... It derives its name from the placing of repentance ashes on the foreheads of participants to either the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." There is a strong biblical base for fasting, particularly during the 40 days of Lent leading to the celebration of Easter. Jesus, as part of his spiritual preparation, went into the wilderness and fasted 40 days and 40 nights, according to the Gospels.

<u>The Distribution of Ashes</u> During Mass, the ashes which give Ash Wednesday its name are distributed. The ashes are made by burning the blessed palms that were distributed the previous year on Palm Sunday.

During Lent, as part of our Wednesday Adoration, we will celebrate the <u>Stations of the</u> <u>Cross and Benediction</u> each Wednesday starting at 11.00 a.m. Why not make an effort to join us for this prayer time?
